## III. AWARDS

The dual meet champion trophy will be presented prior to the start of the Thursday evening finals session.

Event medals will be presented immediately following each event, presenting medals to event prior to the event that has just concluded.

**Princeton** will secure the majority of presenters for medal presentations. If there is a need for presenters, coaches will be asked during the logistical meeting (see review of deadlines and important dates) if an administrator or alum from their school would like to present.

Athletes are expected to be in the awards ready area, dressed in official team warm-ups, for the awards presentation. Presentations will not be delayed if athletes are not present.

**For relay events, only the top 3 finishing teams will take the podium for awards.** All teams will receive medals, but finishers 4<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>, will not be presented their medals on the podium.

The team champion and individual awards ceremony will take place at the conclusion of Saturday evening's finals. Awards will be presented in the following order:

- Karl B. Michael Award: Outstanding Diver (determined by points earned in championship)
- Phil Moriarty Award: Outstanding Swimmer (determined by points earned in championship)
- Ron Keenhold Award: Career High Point Diver (determined by cumulative points over four years – seniors only)
- Harold S. Ulen Award: Career High Point Swimmer (determined by cumulative points over four years – seniors only)
- Team trophy

## IV. EVENT ADMINISTRATION

### A. *Appeals Procedure*

All appeals must be submitted on the official appeal form, which will be available from the meet referee or league representative. The form must be completed in full and submitted to

the league representative as early as possible for issues prior to the start of the meet. Head coaches who wish to submit an appeal must indicate their protest to the head referee or league representative not later than 15 minutes after the finish of the final heat/round of that event to which the appeal is applicable, and the written form must be completed and submitted not later than 10 minutes following. Appeals must come from head coaches only. Appeals will be acted upon by the meet committee. The decision of this committee is final. Any appeal before, during or immediately after a race should be resolved at the earliest opportunity, but not later than immediately following the current session. The use of video is not permitted during the appeal process.

**B. *Date/Site***

- The date of the Ivy Men’s Championship Meet will be the first full weekend in March (Wednesday must be in March). In years when the NCAA zone Diving Championships are held the Monday-Wednesday of the week immediately following the Ivy League Men’s Swimming and Diving Championships, the Ivy League Men’s and Women’s Swimming and Diving Championships will move one week earlier.
- The following is the site rotation for the Ivy Men’s Championships:
  - 2027 – Brown
  - 2028 – Princeton
  - 2029 – Brown

**C. *Format***

A four-day individual and team championship, with preliminary and final competition except in the 1000-yard freestyle, 1650-yard freestyle, 200-yard medley relay, 400-yard medley relay, 200-yard freestyle relay, 400-yard freestyle relay, and 800-yard freestyle relay, which shall be timed final events.

The 1000-yard freestyle will be swum slowest-to-fastest with the fastest heat swum during the evening finals. All but the fastest heat of the 1000-yard freestyle will swim starting at approximately 4:00 pm on Friday afternoon. The 1650-yard freestyle will be swum slowest-to-fastest with the last heat swum during the evening finals. All but the fastest heat of the 1650-yard freestyle will swim starting at approximately 4:00 pm on Saturday afternoon. The exact schedules will be posted following the scratch deadline.

In all prelims/finals swimming events, the evening finals will consist of a scoring bonus final, consolation final and championship final. Eight lanes will be used for all competition, and 24 places will be scored.

Competitors in the championship finals, the fastest heats of the 1000 freestyle and 1650 freestyle, as well as all evening heats of the relay events, will march-out from the “ready area” immediately before competing.

**D. *Meet Committee***

Comprised of the head coaches from all eight schools, head referee, diving operations director (when applicable), an Ivy League representative, and championships director. The diving coaches will serve as advisors, with no voting power. Coaches directly involved in a situation being reviewed by the meet committee, will remove themselves prior to any vote. This committee will handle situations dealing with the conduct of the championship (not rules) and must be on call during all competition times.

**E. Rules**

NCAA Swimming & Diving rules will be in effect.

**F. Tiebreaker Procedure**

In the event that two swimmers tie for an Ivy League Championship event title and both swimmers meet or exceed the NCAA Championship qualifying standard in that event, the following procedure shall be used to determine the recipient of the Ivy League’s automatic qualifier (AQ) bid for the NCAA Championships:

1. If one of the swimmers have already earned an individual automatic qualification (AQ) in a previous event during the same championship competition, the NCAA automatic bid for the tied event shall be awarded to the swimmer who has not yet earned an automatic qualification (AQ).
2. In the event that both swimmers have already earned an individual automatic qualification (AQ) or neither swimmer has earned one, the NCAA automatic bid shall be awarded to the swimmer who has recorded the fastest time in the qualifying event during the current championship season at a bona fide competition. This evaluation shall include all officially recognized swims, including preliminary heats, so long as they are achieved in bona fide NCAA competitions.
3. If the tie remains after steps one and two, a swim-off shall be conducted according to the following schedule:
  - a. *Tie occurs on Thursday* – the swim-off shall take place on Friday, after the conclusion of the Friday preliminary session, and not sooner than 30 minutes after each swimmer has completed their final preliminary event of that session.
  - b. *Tie occurs on Friday* – the swim-off shall take place on Saturday, after the conclusion of the Saturday preliminary session, and not sooner than 30 minutes after each swimmer has completed their final preliminary event of that session.
  - c. *Tie occurs on Saturday* – the swim-off shall take place on Saturday, not sooner than 30 minutes after each swimmer has completed their final event of the Saturday finals session. (with the exception of the mile – there will not be a swim off for this event)
4. If a swim-off cannot be conducted due to injury, medical scratch, meet timelines, weather, facility limitations, or any other circumstance mutually acknowledged by both coaches, the head coaches of the tied athletes in consultation with the Ivy League office may mutually agree on an alternative tie-breaking method (i.e., coin flip).

<b>V. MEDICAL INFORMATION</b>

**A. Emergency**

**Princeton** Athletic Training will ensure a thorough understanding by all parties, including the leadership of participating teams, of the personnel and procedures associated with the medical plan. A member of the sports medicine department will send communication

supplying all emergency information about the event to the participating team's athletic training staff.

**C. Miscellaneous**

Water and ice will be provided on the pool deck. **Princeton** Athletic Training Staff will send communication supplying all emergency information about the event to the participating teams' athletic training staff. The participating teams' athletic training staff is to notify the athletic training coordinator, of any special needs of their participating student-athletes, including any medical orders for treatments to be carried out during the event by the date listed in the deadlines and important dates section.

**D. Physician**

All emergencies will be handled by the facility emergency team. Any non-life threatening emergency and/or injury will be referred to the Athletic Trainer on duty. A **Princeton** team physician will also be on-call and notified if needed.

**E. Training Room/Massage Information**

**Princeton** will provide water, ice, and a training table for the event.

<b>VI. TEAM INFORMATION</b>
-----------------------------

**A. Accommodations, Hotels and Travel**

Each team is responsible for securing their own hotel and travel accommodations. Each team is also required to submit a **team information form** to the Ivy Office by the deadline (refer to the review of deadlines and important dates section). **B. Automatic Judging and Timing**

Colorado Timing System, electronic judging and timing will be used throughout the championship. Please note that NCAA regulations require that three watch times be used for NCAA Championship qualifying times in the event of an electronic timing system failure. There will always be at least two meet-provided backup timers for each lane. Relay electronic judging equipment will be used for relays.

**C. Banners**

The hanging of banners will be allowed in the pool area under the following restrictions:

- a. Team banners must be provided to Jack Jephson, no later than **3pm** on Wednesday, February 25.
- b. Banners will be hung by **Princeton** Staff only.
- c. Championship staff reserves discretion in the placement of banners based on size so as not to interfere with deck activities. **Any other team posters or signs in the pool area will be removed.**

#### **D. Coaches Meeting**

A head coaches meeting to review championships logistics will be held virtually on the date listed in review of deadlines and important dates. A separate virtual meeting to review championships diving logistics will be held on the date listed in the review of deadlines and important dates. **It is mandatory that the head coach for each team participate/present at the respective meetings.**

#### **E. Diving Format**

For both one-meter and three-meter diving, there will be seven certified diving judges for preliminaries, consolation final and championship final.

##### **Team Diving Relay EXHIBITION:**

There will be a team diving relay *exhibition* on **Wednesday** in between the 200-yard medley relay and 800-yard freestyle relay. Teams will be comprised of three (3) divers from the same institution. Each diver completes two dives of the prescribed list of six (6) dives/two (2) dives at either level: 1M or 3M.

- The team must complete one (1) dive from every group: Front, back, reverse, inward, twist, and repeat for a total of six (6) dives.
- The team must complete three (3) dives on 1M and three (3) dives on 3M in any order.
- The of total score of each dive will be the final team score.
- Standard judging and scoring rules apply for each individual dive. Coaches will serve as judges for the exhibition event.
- No team points are awarded toward the championship.
- Teams will declare participation in the event by diving coaches meeting.

##### **One-Meter Diving:**

- ***Preliminary:*** The one-meter preliminary will begin at 1:30 pm on **Thursday**. Each contestant will perform six optional dives, including one from each of five groups, in any order, without limit on degree of difficulty. Scores on all dives performed by each contestant will be used to determine the ranking at the conclusion of the preliminary round. Contestants finishing first through eighth will continue into the final round. Contestants finishing ninth through 16th will continue into the consolation final, but may not advance in finish higher than ninth-place. Contestants finishing 17th through 24th have no further opportunity to advance in place.
- ***Consolation Final:*** The one-meter consolation final will take place fifteen minutes following the conclusion of the one-meter preliminaries. Each contestant will start with a score of zero. The consolation final will consist of six optional dives, including one from each of five groups, in any order, without limit on degree of difficulty. Scores on all dives performed by each diver in the consolation finals will be used to determine ninth through 16th place. The diving order will be in reverse order of preliminary place finish.
- ***Final:*** The one-meter final will take place during the championship final session on **Thursday** evening. The eight finalists will start with a score of zero. The final will consist of six optional dives, including one from each of five groups, in any order, without limit on degree of difficulty. Scores on all dives performed by each contestant in the final will be used to determine first through eighth place. The diving order will be in reverse order of preliminary place finish.

##### **Three-Meter Diving:**

- ***Preliminary:*** The three-meter preliminary will begin at 1:30 pm on **Friday**. Each contestant will perform six optional dives, including one from each of five groups, in any

order, without limit on degree of difficulty. Scores on all dives performed by each contestant will be used to determine the ranking at the conclusion of the preliminary round. Contestants finishing first through eighth will continue into the final round. Contestants finishing ninth through 16th will continue into the consolation final, but may not advance in finish higher than ninth place. Contestants finishing 17th through 24th have no further opportunity to advance in place.

- ***Consolation Final:*** The three-meter consolation final will take place during the championship final session on **Friday** evening. Each contestant will start with a score of zero. The consolation final will consist of six optional dives, including one from each of five groups, in any order, without limit on degree of difficulty. Scores on all dives performed by each diver in the consolation finals will be used to determine ninth through 16th place. The diving order will be in reverse order of preliminary place finish.
- ***Final:*** The three-meter final will take place during the championship final session on **Saturday** evening. The eight finalists will start with a score of zero. The final will consist of six optional dives, including one from each of five groups, in any order, without limit on degree of difficulty. Scores on all dives performed by each contestant in the final will be used to determine first through eighth place. The diving order will be in reverse order of preliminary place finish.
- **DIVE MEETS:** Divers and dives must be properly entered into Dive Meets no later than 24-hours prior to the first diving event (Thursday at 1:30pm).

#### ***F. Entrance***

Coaches, participants, managers, trainers, sports information staff, administrative staff, officials and championship personnel should enter through Caldwell field house, go down the stairs and through the tunnel to gain access to DeNunzio Pool. Deck passes for coaches, managers, trainers and massage therapists will be distributed at Wednesday's practice. All other personnel may obtain deck passes at the ticket office at Jadwin Gym (which is right next to DeNunzio Pool). All competing athletes in team gear will be admitted to the deck level. **All coaches and team personnel will need to wear a deck pass in order to access the deck level.** Athletes who are not participating in the championship meet will not be permitted on deck. Each team is to submit the names of those who will need deck passes with their team information to the Ivy office by the deadline (refer to review of deadlines and important dates).

#### ***G. Entry Procedure/Squad Sizes***

- Each team is permitted eighteen (18) competitors as described by the following: an entrant who swims will be counted as one; an entrant who dives will be counted as one third; an entrant who swims and dives will be counted as one. Each team is permitted one (1) non-scoring alternate.
- **Entries are due by the deadline (see review of deadlines and important dates). All possible entries must be listed on the entry form and best times must be submitted.**
- Please be sure to specify entry times for your relays in the appropriate area on the entry form, even if the entry time is "NT" (no time).
- Entries submitted must be best performances **attained between September 1, 2025 and February 17, 2026.**
- **Coaches must submit entries using Hy-Tek Team Manager. A Team Manager events file will be distributed to all coaches. You must also submit a copy of your Team Manager entry report (preferably in Adobe PDF format). This report, and**

**your Team Manager entry file, must be sent to Ellen Mace ([besmarttinc@gmail.com](mailto:besmarttinc@gmail.com)).**

- It is imperative that all athletes entered match EXACTLY to the roster submitted to the NCAA Database. These values will be used for the purposes of NCAA and USA Swimming database submissions. The host team will submit all results to the NCAA database. Please make sure that the names submitted match the names listed in the NCAA database exactly. The “preferred name” field is to be used for appropriate nicknames, which will be printed on heat sheets and results, and will be the name used for announcing purposes. (e.g., “Greg” instead of “Gregory”)
- A competitor is permitted to compete in a maximum of seven events, of which no more than three may be individual events.
- Coaches may enter an unlimited number of competitors, and competitors may be entered in more than three individual events. Individual event scratch procedures and deadlines are outlined in Part O of this manual.
- After the unofficial psych sheet is posted, teams will have 24 hours to challenge entries and correct any clerical errors with no penalty. After 24 hours, no corrections will be accepted.
- **All head coaches must declare their final 18 competitors no later than 3:30 PM on Wednesday, February 25, 2025. The final competitors will be declared by filling out the scratch form provided by the host institution at the Wednesday Coaches Meeting.**
- **A new psych sheet reflecting final competitors will be emailed to coaches before the start of competition on February 25, 2025.**
- **If any institution does not declare its final 18 competitors by the deadline, then the last names listed as entries will be scratched by the meet manager to bring the number of competitors down to 18.**
- **If anyone on the roster of 18 competitors becomes sick or injured between 3:30pm Wednesday and 8:00am Thursday and an athletic trainer or physician attests in person that they are unable to compete, then an institution can change their final competitor list by adding one of their scratched competitors back into the meet.**
- Each team’s alternate athlete is permitted as a non-scoring exhibition competitor who may compete in accordance with Rule 5, Article 1 of the NCAA Swimming and Diving Rule Book. The exhibition alternate must be declared by the Wednesday scratch deadline.

#### **H. *Facilities and Equipment***

DeNunzio Pool features an eight-lane competitive course, with double anti-wave lane lines and a Colorado timing system with full alphanumeric video scoreboard display and relay takeoff pads. The racing course has a depth of 12 feet at the starting end and 10 feet at the turning end. There are adjoining warm-up lanes within the pool. The diving well features two 1-meter boards, two 3-meter boards, and 1-meter, 3-meter, 5-meter, 7.5-meter and 10-meter platforms, and has a water depth of 17 feet.

#### **I. *Facility Availability***

The DeNunzio Pool will be open to meet participants all day on Wednesday starting at 9:00 am, and Thursday-Saturday from 6:30 am until the end of championship finals. **Please notify Jack Jephson (Championship Director) if you have any questions.**

#### **J. *Hospitality***

Breakfast, lunch and dinner will be available for coaches, meet personnel and officials in the

**DeNunzio Conference Room** on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday of the meet. Accessing the hospitality area will require the appropriate credentials.

**K. Locker Rooms**

Teams will be assigned a locker room prior to arriving. Both locker rooms will be used exclusively for the championship meet Wednesday through Saturday. Please follow signs to the appropriate locker room. **PRINCETON** is not responsible for lost or stolen articles. Valuables should not be kept in the locker rooms. Locks are not available and personal locks cannot be left on lockers overnight. Glass bottles are not permitted anywhere within DeNunzio Pool.

**L. Merchandise**

The Ivy office will be selling event t-shirts. If you are interested in placing a team order for event shirts please submit sizes and quantities on the team information form by the deadline.

**M. Ivy League on ESPN**

The championships broadcast will be produced by the host institution and all sessions will be available live on ESPN+.

**N. Parking**

Officials, Team Vans and Administrators - Parking specific information will be sent to the Ivy League office and distributed to all coaches prior to the championship. Teams should expect Parking Information in early February.

Spectators- Parking specific information will be sent to the Ivy League office and distributed to all coaches prior to the championship. Teams should expect Parking Information in early February.

**O. Scratch Deadlines**

- Scratches may only be submitted to the Director of Meet Operations, Championship Director or Meet Referee. Scratches will only be accepted from coaches or the team's official representative and must be signed by both the team coach and the appropriate meet official (see above).
- A receipt form will be used for scratch verification. All entries not scratched by the scratch deadline will become official entries. Coaches will be given a composite scratch form to list all scratches for a particular day. Additional scratches may be made, by the scratch deadline, using individual scratch cards. Diving sheets must be submitted by the appropriate scratch deadlines. Divers who will not dive must be scratched. The scratch deadlines are as follows:
  - **Wednesday, 2:00 pm** for all Wednesday events
  - **Wednesday, 6:00 pm** for all Thursday events
  - **Thursday, 6:00 pm** for all Friday events
  - **Friday, 6:00 pm** for all Saturday events
- Rule 5, Section 3, Article 4 of the NCAA Swimming & Diving Rulebook will be followed regarding scratches for the evening finals. Scratches for evening finals must be made using individual scratch cards, and must be signed by both the team coach and the appropriate meet official (see above). Scratches for finals must be submitted to the appropriate meet official (see above) within 30 minutes of the announcement of the qualifiers for the event.

**P. Senior Recognition**

The senior recognition will take place at the beginning of the Saturday evening finals. Seniors will be asked to gather in the awards ready area at 5:50 pm in their official team warm-ups. All seniors on a team’s roster at the time of the championship will be recognized, and those who are in attendance will be invited to participate in the senior recognition. **The competition pool will be cleared at 5:45pm for the recognition.**

**Q. Student Athlete Surveys**

Following the championship student-athletes will be asked to provide feedback for improvement in future planning/administration via an on-line survey. A coach will be designated to distribute the survey to their student-athletes. Please complete the student-athlete survey contact section on the team information form by the date listed in the review of deadlines and important dates section.

**R. Team Seating**

Team seating on the pool deck will be determined at the coaches meeting. Seating selection will be chosen based on the order of last year’s finish (Princeton, Harvard, Yale, Brown, Cornell, Columbia, Penn, Dartmouth).

**Teams and athletes are not allowed to be on the main starting bulkhead during diving events.**
