Championship Policies

Awards, Post-Championship

Awards will be presented shortly after the conclusion of the finals in each event. An awards timeline will be distributed during the Wed. Coaches Meeting. The top three finalists (gold, silver, bronze) will be presented medals at an "awards area" location TBD <u>immediately after each Finals event</u>. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be given to the top three finalists in each individual event and to the top three relay teams <u>immediately</u> <u>after each Finals event</u>. At the conclusion of the meet, a team trophy will be awarded to the championship team, as well as a second place trophy. Individual plaques for the following will also be awarded:

Outstanding Swimmer #
Outstanding Diver #
Rookie of the Meet #
Coaching Staff of the Year *

To be awarded based upon total points scored during the meet, plus additional points for a Conference record (3), an NCAA B qualifier (4) and an NCAA A qualifier (5).

* As voted upon by the coaches in attendance at the meet.

All-Conference recognition will be awarded in Swimming & Diving to the top three finishers and top three relay teams in each event and will be announced in the days following the Championship meet.

Student-athletes participating in the swimming and diving championship will receive an NEC commemorative gift. Participant gifts (charcoal color, hoodies) will most likely be mailed to each school's head coach prior to the Championship.

Backup Timers

<u>Teams will be required to supply backup timers for both the Prelims and the Finals.</u> Lane assignments will be solidified during Wednesday's Coaches Meeting.

Banners

Team banners/signs will only be hung by NEC/Eisenhower Aquatics personnel. Teams are required to submit their team banners/signs when they arrive on Wednesday.

Camera Usage/Flash Bulbs/ Video Taping Instructions

Media and school personnel only, with proper credentials may photograph/webstream on the pool deck. Any other photographers without press credentials **MUST** film/videotape from the pool balcony.

Reminder: There should be no flash photography at the start of any race.

Coaches Meeting

A mandatory pre-championship meeting to review logistics and procedures for the meet will be held on Wed, Feb. 13 at 2:00 pm in the dance studio (room off of dive well side of the pool).

If you want a specific issue regarding the championship discussed at the meeting, please contact Benjamin Shove at the Northeast Conference office by Wed. Feb. 12.

NOTE: The pre-championship meeting will be limited to issues pertinent to the championship. A coaches' conference call has been scheduled for a later date. to discuss sport-related issues.

Certification of Eligibility

It is the responsibility of each institution to certify that all student-athletes entered to participate in the championship(s) meet all applicable NCAA, Northeast Conference and institutional requirements and are eligible to represent their respective institution in NCAA and NEC competition.

Code of Conduct/Sportsmanship

Each participating institution in this championship has the primary responsibility to cultivate and maintain wholesome conditions and behavior for coaches, athletes and spectators by ensuring maximum sportsmanlike conduct throughout the championship(s). The Conference's code of conduct requires coaches and athletes to conduct themselves in a dignified and courteous manner. Negative comments, insults and physical threats to other individuals (e.g., participants, officials, via social media) will not be tolerated and will lead to immediate ejection from the championship and could lead to additional sanctions from the Conference office (e.g., letter of reprimand, suspension from subsequent NEC competition).

Start out going N on James Doolittle Blvd towards Charles Lindbergh Blvd.; Turn slight right onto Charles Lindbergh Blvd; Take Meadowbrook Pkwy N ramp; Keep left at the fork.; Merge onto Merrick Ave.; Turn left onto NY-24/Hempstead Tnpk.; Turn left onto E. Meadow Ave.; Aquatics Center is located on 1899 Hempstead Tnpk.

Buses and team vans dropping off student-athletes to the aquatics center are instructed to drop off in loop in front of the facility. Bus parking is located in lot #1. Lot #1 is located off Merrick Ave on the other side of the hockey rink facility. (map attached)

Diving

1M (Thurs.) & 3M (Sat.) Diving Prelims (6 dives) and Finals (6 dives) will consist of six optional dives, including one from each of five groups, in any order, without limit on degree of difficulty.

Only the top eight divers from Prelims will advance to Finals (performed at night during the intermission). 1M (Thurs.) & 3M (Sat.) Dive Consolation dives (9-16) will also be performed (immediately after that day's Prelims session competition.

A seven-person scoring panel will be utilized, made up of diving coaches and Championship meet officials.

1M Diving will occur on Thurs. Feb. 19 and 3M Diving will occur on Sat. Feb. 22

An event list, by event number, on the next page, is provided to assist in setting up the meet in your computer to complete your entries. Remember to keep a copy for your team's records also.

Please note the following when submitting your entries...

- Each team may enter as many SAs as they wish but must designate their 18 scorers during the Wed. Coaches meeting. Any athlete competing in a swimming event counts as one scorer and any athlete competing in diving events only counts as 1/3 of a scorer.
- A competitor may swim in a maximum of seven events, of which no more than three may be individual events.
- Swimmers competing in relay only events must be listed on your entries.
- When entering swimmers in the 1,650 yard freestyle, **you must submit 1,650 yard freestyle times** for seeding purposes. Competitors may enter the 1,650 without an entry time (NT).
- Divers must obtain a score from this 2019-20 regular season competition on either board in order to enter the NEC Championship. "No score" entries will be permitted on either 1M or 3M provided the SA has a score on either board from the current season. The USA Swims database must be used for swimming entry time conversions.
- Exhibition swimmers are permitted. They are defined as participants beyond the squad limit of 18. They are not eligible to score points in the meet. Exhibition swimmers <u>MUST</u> be designated at the pre-championship coaches' meeting.

Event Start Times

Swimming Trials will start at 10:00 am each day.

Swimming Finals will start at 6:00 pm on Wed., Thurs. Fri. & Sat. Time trials, if necessary, will take place following the swimming Prelims on Thurs. Fri. & Sat.

The C/B 1,650 freestyle consolations will take place before the evening Finals warm-up on Saturday. The Final 1,650 heat (seeded by 1,650 entry times) will be the first event of the Saturday night Finals session. (For Example: Saturday's C & B 1,650 consolations will take place at 4:20 pm and 4:40 pm, (official warm-up session at 5:00 pm, Final heat of 1,650 free at 6:00 pm.)

The 1M Diving Prelims will start Thurs. approximately 12:30 pm. The six 1M Finals dives (top eight only) will occur during the Thurs. night intermission between the 200 MR & 800 FR. The 3M Diving Prelims will start on Sat. at 12:30 pm. The six 3M Finals dives (top eight only) will occur during the Sat. night intermission between the 100 Back and 400 MR.

Facility Information

Built in 1998 for the International Goodwill Games, the Nassau County Aquatic Center in Eisenhower Park regularly hosts major swimming & diving competitions and over the years, dozens of U.S. and world swimming records have been set at the Aquatic Center. The 80,000-square-foot center includes a "stretch" 50-meter pool that is 68 meters long, with three movable bulkheads. There is a diving well with a 10-meter competition diving tower — the only such tower in the New York metropolitan area — and 1- and 3-meter springboards. The NEC conducted its' women's championship at the Nassau County Aquatic Center in 2018 & 2019.

Format

Nine (9) women's teams will compete in the Swimming & Diving championship.

The meet will be held over four days, Wed. Feb. 19 - Sat. Feb. 22, 2019 Prelims will be held starting at 10:00 am each day and Finals will be held starting at 6:00 pm each evening. The NCAA Championship meet three-day format will be followed, with the exception of the 200 MR & 800 FR, taking place Wednesday evening.

Hotel

Medical

Participating institutions are expected to bring their own athletic trainer to the Championship. A first-aid area will be set up on the pool deck for injury evaluations and taping. Modalities will not be available at this site. Water, cups and injury ice will be provided by the LIU & SFBK athletic training staffs. Splinting materials, crutches and OSHA supplies will be available. Visiting teams should bring their own tape, towels, coolers, etc. An EMT & Paramedic will be onsite for all diving practices & diving competitions. The NEC will provide ice for ice baths. Each school is responsible for bringing its own tubs or small inflatable pools.

Parking

Buses and team vans dropping off student-athletes to the Aquatics Center are instructed to drop off in loop in front of the facility. Bus parking is located in lot #1. Lot #1 is located off Merrick Ave on the other side of the hockey rink facility. (map attached) All other general parking is located in front of facility or nearby Lot # 1a.

Protest Procedures

The on-site representative of the Conference office, using all appropriate resources available shall serve as the final authority on any changes, additions, deletions and/or interpretation of NEC policy as necessary, during and/or after all NEC championships. The NEC office representative will handle all protests/appeals, after consulting with the head referee and meet committee (to be selected at random during Wednesday's Coaches Meeting). The head referee shall serve as the final authority on any interpretations of the rules of swimming. The NCAA's Appeal Procedure (Rule 8, Article 9, pgs. 108-109) as outlined in the NCAA Swimming & Diving Rule Book will be followed. Appeal forms will be included in the coaches packets distributed at the championship.

Ready Room (Area)

A 'ready area', made available for swimmers participating in each individual Finals event, will be located at a location TBD. 'Finals' participants will walk from the 'ready area' to the blocks prior to the swimmer introductions of the championship heats.

Relays

"A" and "B" relay teams will be allowed. Only "A" relay teams will score in the meet. "B" relay teams will only swim during the Prelims session and cannot score or advance to Finals.

Rosters / Squad Size

Each team may enter a maximum of 18 competitors in the meet. Divers count as 1/3 of a competitor. A competitor may swim in a maximum of seven events, of which no more than three may be individual events. Swimmers competing in relay only events must be listed on entry forms.

Rules

The meet will be governed by the 2019-20 NCAA Men's & Women's Swimming & Diving Rules book, except as altered by the NEC Policy Manual or by any action of the NEC office representative.

Swimming finals will consist of three heats:

Heat One: C Final (non-scoring)

Heat Two: B Final (scoring), consisting of the 9-16 fastest (non-exhibition) swimmers. Heat Three: Championship Final (scoring), consisting of the 1-8 fastest swimmers.

Note: Student-athletes have 30 minutes from the announcement of finalists to 'scratch' from finals.

Eight lanes will be used for Prelim events. Eight lanes will be used for Finals events All ten lanes will be used for the 1,650

Scoring Format

Scoring will follow 2019-20 NCAA championship rules.

Individual events will be scored, top 16, as follows: 20-17-16-15-14-13-12-11-9-7-6-5-4-3-2-1

Relay events will be scored, top 16, as follows: 40-34-32-30-28-26-24-22-18-14-12-10-8-6-4-2

Scratch Box

The scratch box will be located at the computer operator's table. Names of relay competitors must be presented to the computer operator before each relay is contested, preferably at least 15 minutes before the race.

The scratch box will close at the conclusion of the coaches meeting on Wednesday night for Thursday's events. It will close each night at 6:00 pm for the next day's events.

Seeding

Swimmers are to be assigned lanes by the process of seeding. Seeded positions shall be based upon the times submitted on the entry forms. The fastest bona fide time of each entry must be submitted.

Swimmers with no established time for a given event may enter that event without submitting a time (NT). Such swimmers will be seeded in random order behind all other swimmers who have submitted entry times but can swim into position to score team points.

*The 1,650 yard freestyle will be seeded based on swimmers 1,650 yard times.

Senior Recognition

There will be a senior recognition before Saturday night's Finals. Each team's coach will be asked to hand deliver single, long stem flowers to each of their graduating seniors on the bulkhead, prior the National Anthem. Please submit your list of graduating seniors to Benjamin Shove with your credential list. A form is attached at the back of this handbook.

Statistics/Records

The NEC will provide results of each day's events at the end of the day and complete results and a release following the completion of the championship. Race results will also be available to coaches on the pool deck and/or at the official scoring table. In addition, race results will be posted in various spots in the spectator seating area. Race results will also be posted to at www.northeastconference.org; and via the Meet Mobile app.

Team Seating

Team seating will be based upon the order of finish in the 2019 Championship. Team seating will be chosen at the coaches meeting on Wednesday. The following will be the order of team seating: BRY, CCSU, SFU, WAG, LIU, SHU, SFBK, MSM & MC.


